AN ORDINANCE to amend the Agricultural Fires Ordinance.

[9th December, 1926.]

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Agricultural Fires (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, and shall be read as one with the Agricultural Fires Ordinance, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance. Short title and Construction. Cap. 135.

2. The following section shall be inserted in the Principal Ordinance as section 3A :— Power to appoint Fire Vigilance Committees.

3A. It shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint for any County a Fire Vigilance Committee, consisting of such persons as the Governor by notice in the *Royal Gazette* may appoint. It shall be lawful for the Governor to revoke any such appointment by notice in the *Royal Gazette*.

**3.** Section 18 (1) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding after the word "Constabulary" the words "or any Deputy Conservator of Forests or Principal Forest Ranger or any District Engineer, Assistant District Engineer or Chief Road Overseer of the Public Works Department or any member of a Fire Vigilance Committee within the county for which he is appointed."
