AN ORDINANCE to vest in the Crown the property known as the Drill Hall in Port-of-Spain.

WHEREAS by a certain deed of lease dated the 28th day of April, 1885, made between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part and George Grant, James Henry Collens, Alexander McGruer, James Elderfield McCracken, Charles Joseph Thavenot and Charles John Rooks (therein and hereinafter referred to as "the Lessees") of the other part, all that parcel of land formerly part of the Tranquillity Lands situate at Port-of-Spain and bounded on the North by Crown land occupied by the Model School, on the South by the Tragarete Road, on the East partly by Crown land and partly by the Wesleyan Church and on the

West by a street was demised unto the Lessees for the term of one hundred and ninety-nine years from the said 28th day of April, 1885 ;

And whereas by a certain deed poll dated the 30th day of October, 1885, the Lessees declared that the said parcel of land was in fact demised unto them with the intent that the same should be held upon trust for the Trinidad Volunteer Corps established under Ordinance No. 6 of 1879;

And whereas by section 49 of the Local Forces Ordinance it is *inter alia* enacted that all lands belonging to a Volunteer Corps shall vest in the Commanding Officer of the Corps for the time being and his successors in office ;

And whereas it is expedient that the unexpired residue of the term created by the said lease should be extinguished and merged in the reversion and inheritance of the said parcel of land ;

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

Short title.

**1.** This Ordinance may be cited as the Drill Hall, Port-of-Spain, Ordinance, 1926.

Merger of

**2.** The residue of the term of one hundred and ninety-nine years created by the above recited deed of lease and all other the estate and interest of the Lessees and of any Officer of the Local Forces in the said parcel of land shall and the same is hereby declared to be extinguished and merged in the reversion and inheritance of the same.
