AN ORDINANCE to amend the Spirits and Spirit
Compounds Ordinance, No. 176.

[27th September, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Spirits and Spirit Compounds (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922, and shall be read as one with the Spirits and Spirit Compounds Ordinance, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 46 of the Principal Ordinance shall be read with the addition of the following proviso :—

Provided that the payment of duty in respect of rum removed from any licensed Warehouse for the manufacture of compounds intended for export may,

at the discretion of the Receiver-General, be deferred for a period not exceeding eight months from the date of such removal if the owner of such rum shall secure the payment of such duty by a bond with one or more sufficient sureties in a sum equal at least to the duty chargeable in respect of such rum, or by a general bond in such sum as may be required by the Receiver-General.
