

AN ORDINANCE to validate certain marriages.

[ 8<sup>th</sup> November, 1921.]

WHEREAS doubts have arisen concerning the validity of the marriages in the schedule to this Ordinance by reason of the same having been contracted before Assistant Wardens;

And whereas it is expedient to declare all such marriages to be valid;

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Marriage (Validity) Short title. Ordinance, 1921.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Marriage Ordinance, No. 59, the marriages the particulars whereof are set forth in the schedule hereto shall be and be held to be good and valid in law to all intents and purposes whatsoever and the issue of such marriages to have ever been and to be legitimate. - The marriage contracted between Asgar Ali, aged 28, bachelor, tailor, and Saheedan, aged 24, spinster, before Frank Norris Brierly, Esquire, at the Warden's Office in San Fernando on 3rd January, 1920.
- The marriage contracted between Sheikh Mahomed Jaleel, aged 24, bachelor, clerk, and Amina, aged 21, spinster, before Louis Alexander Vilain, Esquire, at the Warden's Office in San Fernando on 15th January, 1921.
