AN ORDINANCE to amend the law as to the period of service as an articled clerk required for admission as a solicitor.

[2nd November, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Solicitors' Ordinance, 1920, and shall be construed as one with the Solicitors' Ordinance, 1912 (in this Ordinance called the "Principal Ordinance"), as amended by the Solicitors' Ordinance, 1914, and the Solicitors' (Amendment) Ordinance, 1917.

Short title and construction.

2.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Principal Ordinance as amended as aforesaid, the period of service as an articled clerk before admission and enrolment as a solicitor shall, if the articled clerk has passed the examination for higher certificates of the Oxford and Cambridge Schools Examination Board, be four years.

Service as articled clerk.

(2.) This Ordinance applies to a clerk articled as well before as after the commencement of this Ordinance.
