AN ORDINANCE to provide for the observance of a
Christmas Vacation by the Supreme Court.

[4th November, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Supreme Court Short title and
(Christmas Vacation) Ordinance, 1920, and shall be construed construction.

2. In addition to the vacation from the twenty-sixth day Christmas
of June to the third day of October prescribed by section vacation.
seven of the Judicature (Amendment) Ordinance, 1916, the
period from the twentieth day of December to the second
day of January (both days inclusive) in every year shall be
observed as a vacation by the Supreme Court, but so that

Ord. 9-1918. such vacation shall not extend to appeals under the Summary Conviction Offences (Procedure) Ordinance, 1918, and so also that at least one judge shall remain in the Colony.
