AN ORDINANCE to provide for the payment to Adolphus Wilson, retired signalman of the Railway Department, of a reduced pension and gratuity based on his salary at the date of his retirement from the service of the Government.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment,

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Adolphus Wilson (Gratuity and Reduced Pension) Ordinance, 1945.

Short title.

Authority to pay gratuity of \$345 and annual pension of \$108.50 to Adolphus Wilson.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any law relating to the grant of pensions, there may be paid from general revenue to Adolphus Wilson, retired signaller of the Railway Department, in respect of his service with the Government a gratuity and reduced pension computed on the basis of the salary which he was receiving at the date of his retirement from the service of the Government, that is to say, a gratuity of three hundred and forty-five dollars and a pension, as from the 1st January, 1945, at the rate of one hundred and three dollars and fifty cents per annum.

Passed in Council this twenty-sixth day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-five.
