*Wireless Telegraphy.*

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance, Ch. 33. No. 2.

[31st December, 1941 ]

Commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Wireless Telegraphy (Amendment) Ordinance, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

Ch. 36. No. 2.

2. The definition of the expression " wireless telegraphy " in section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting a comma for the semi-colon at the end thereof and adding the following :—

Section 2 of Principal Ordinance amended.

and also includes the dissemination at a number of points of messages or other communications received at one or more wireless receivers to which the points of dissemination are connected by wire either directly or through amplifiers or other apparatus ;

3. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following section :—

Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance repealed and replaced.

Wireless licences.

3. (1) No person shall install or use in the Colony any wireless apparatus unless he is in possession of a valid licence in that behalf granted to him either in accordance with Regulations made under this Ordinance or in accordance with subsection (2) of this section, or otherwise than in conformity with the terms and conditions specified in his licence.

(2) In any case in which it shall appear to the Governor in Council that no provision has been made by Regulations made under this Ordinance for the issue of an appropriate licence, or that the circumstances of the case justify the issue of a special licence, the Governor in Council may issue a special licence for the installation and using of wireless apparatus on payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as to the Governor in Council may seem fit.

(3) Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with the provisions of subsection (1) of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two hundred and forty dollars or to imprisonment for six months, and the apparatus or installation in regard to which the offence was committed may, by order of the Court, be forfeited to His Majesty.
