AN ORDINANCE to amend the Trade Disputes
(Arbitration and Inquiry) Ordinance, 1938.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Trade Disputes Short title.
(Arbitration and Inquiry) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938.

2. Section 10 of the Trade Disputes (Arbitration and Sec. 10 of Ord.
No. 7—1938
amended.
Inquiry) Ordinance, 1938, is hereby amended by deleting
the proviso at the end thereof and substituting therefor
the following—

“ Provided always that, if any witness objects
to answer any question or to produce any
document on the ground that it will tend to
incriminate him or on any other lawful ground,
he shall not be required to answer such
question or to produce such document, nor
shall he be liable to any penalties for refusing
to do so.”
