AN ORDINANCE for the Incorporation of certain persons
as Trustees of the Royal Philanthropic Lodge of
Freemasons in Trinidad.

WHEREAS William Elphinstone Reece, Worshipful ^{Preamble.}
Master of the Royal Philanthropic Lodge of Freemasons
in Trinidad, Kenrick Joga Grant, Senior Warden, and
Alfred Charles Cunha, Junior Warden, of the said Lodge
are desirous of being formed into a corporate body :

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the said William
Elphinstone Reece, Kenrick Joga Grant and Alfred Charles
Cunha should be incorporated:

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative
Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Royal ^{Short title.}
Philanthropic Lodge of Freemasons (Incorporation)
Ordinance, 1935.

2. William Elphinstone Reece and his successors in office as Worshipful Master of the Royal Philanthropic Lodge of Freemasons in Trinidad, Kenrick Joga Grant, Senior Warden of the said Lodge, and Alfred Charles Cunha, Junior Warden of the said Lodge, and their successors in office as Senior and Junior Warden of the said Lodge respectively, shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Royal Philanthropic Lodge of Freemasons in Trinidad" and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Colony, and shall have and use a common seal which may from time to time be changed: Provided that no such change shall be made except by a resolution of the members in open lodge assembled.

Trustees may
acquire
property.

3. The corporate body hereby created shall have full power to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or otherwise any real or personal property in the Colony or any estate or interest therein.

Trustees may
dispose of
property.

4. The said corporate body shall, subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it shall have acquired title thereto, be entitled to sell, mortgage, lease, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by it.

Saving of
Crown and
other rights.

5. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of His Majesty or of any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Ordinance and those claiming by, through, from, or under them.

Passed in Council this eighteenth day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.
