AN ORDINANCE for the incorporation of certain persons as Trustees of the Anjuman Sunnat-ul-Jammat Association of Trinidad.

Preamble.

WHEREAS there has been established in the Colony an Association known as the Anjuman Sunnat-ul-Jammat Association of Trinidad (hereinafter called "the Association") :

And whereas Syed Mohamad Hosein of the Town of San Fernando in the said Island of Trinidad, Sworn Hindi Interpreter, has been appointed President of the Association ; John Mohammed of the City of Port-of-Spain in the said Island of Trinidad, Merchant, has been appointed First Vice-President of the Association ; Buckredee Meah and Mustapha Khan both of San Juan in the Ward of St. Ann's in the said Island of Trinidad, Proprietors, have been appointed Trustees of the Association :

And whereas by a resolution of the Association passed on the 26th day of November, 1933, it was resolved that the said Syed Mohamad Hosein, the President, the said John Mohammed, the first Vice-President, the said

Buckredee Meah and Mustapha Khan the two Trustees of the Association and their successors in office be incorporated as Trustees of the Association under the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Anjuman Sunnat-ul-Jammat Association" with power to hold lands and other property in trust for the Association :

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Anjuman Short title. Sunnat-ul-Jammat Association of Trinidad (Incorporation) Ordinance, 1935.

2. The said Syed Mohamad Hosein the President, John Mohammed First Vice-President, Buckredee Meah and Mustapha Khan Trustees as aforesaid and their successors in office shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Anjuman Sunnat-ul-Jammat Association of Trinidad" (hereinafter called "The Incorporated Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Colony and shall have and use a common seal, which may from time to time be changed by the Association. Incorporation of Trustees.

3. The Incorporated Trustees shall, subject to the rules, regulations, and control of the Association, have full power to acquire for the Association by purchase, exchange, demise, gift, bequest, or otherwise, all lands or other property of what nature or kind soever in perpetuity or for a life or lives or for any term of years, and also any money, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever ; and subject to such rules and regulations and control as aforesaid to take, hold and enjoy the same, and subject also to the performance of any trust upon which the said lands or other property, money, securities for money, goods or chattels may have been acquired. Trustees may acquire property.

4. It shall be lawful for the Incorporated Trustees subject to such rules, regulations and control and the performance of any trust as aforesaid, from time to time by deed under their seal to sell or demise, grant, convey, exchange or otherwise dispose of any lands or other property vested or which may hereafter be vested in them.

Saving of  
Crown or  
other rights.

5. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or are referred to in this Ordinance and those claiming by, through, from or under them.

Passed in Council this eighteenth day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.
