AN ORDINANCE relating to the recovery of certain rates  
in the Borough of San Fernando.

[26th February, 1932.]

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the San Fernando Short title.  
(Rates Recovery) Ordinance, 1932.

2. Every rate on houses and lands due and payable to the Council of the Borough of San Fernando under and by virtue of the provisions of any Ordinance for the time being in force, if unpaid at the expiration of three months after the same shall have become due and payable shall be increased by a sum equal to ten per centum of the rate and it shall be lawful for the said Council to recover the said increase of ten per centum in the same manner as the rate on which the same has accrued.

3. (1) Whenever before the commencement of this Ordinance any rate on houses and lands due to the Council of the Borough of San Fernando was increased by a sum equal to ten per centum of such rate, such increased rate shall be deemed to have been a valid charge to all intents and purposes as though such increased rate had been authorized and imposed by law and to the same extent and for the same purposes as the original rate due to the said Council, and any such increased rate already recovered by the said Council shall be deemed to have been legally and properly recovered.

(2) All distress, sale or other process, act, matter or thing done for the purpose of obtaining payment of such increased rate shall be deemed to have been validly done, and the acts of all persons in the *bona fide* discharge of their duties in the recovery of such increased rate are hereby declared to have been and to be good valid and effectual to all intents and purposes.
