AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Dow Village
Ramleela and Cultural Organization and for
matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 11th May, 1989]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago a community service organization known as the Dow Village Ramleela and Cultural Organization: Preamble

And whereas it is expedient that the said Dow Village Ramleela and Cultural Organization be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

- Enactment** ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—
- Short title** 1. This Act may be cited as the Dow Village Ramleela and Cultural Organization (Incorporation) Act, 1989.
- Incorporation** 2. The Dow Village Ramleela and Cultural Organization hereinafter called “the Organization” is hereby created a body corporate.
- Aims and objects** 3. The aims and objects of the Organization are—
- (a) to promote cultural, educational, social and religious activities;
 - (b) to encourage the formation of other Organizations where there are none;
 - (c) to render useful service to others.
- Powers of the Organization** 4. The Organization shall have power to:
- (a) acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, demise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
 - (b) accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
 - (c) sell, exchange, demise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in it, subject to any restraint, reservation or conditions contained in the document under which it has acquired title.
- Transfer or vesting of Property** 5. All real or personal property of whatever nature now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Organization, is hereby transferred to and vested in the Organization.
- Mode of execution of documents** 6. All documents requiring the seal of the Organization, shall be sealed with the common seal of the organization in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office or in the event

of incapacity by some other person or persons authorised for that purpose by the Organization who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Organization.

7. (1) The Organization shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago, and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or change of address as the case may be. Service of documents on the Organization

(2) Every document to be served on the Organization may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the registered address of the Organization.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Organization liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction, therefor.

8. The Organization may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations. Power to make rules

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State, or of any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them. Saving of State and other rights
