AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Quarry Superstars
Sports and Cultural Club and matters incidental
thereto.

[Assented to 17th November, 1997]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and ^{Preamble}
Tobago an organization known as the Quarry
Superstars Sports and Cultural Club:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Quarry Superstars Sports and Cultural Club be incorporated for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Enacted **ENACTED** by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—

Short Title **1.** This Act may be cited as the Quarry Superstars Sports and Cultural Club Act, 1997.

Incorporation **2.** The Quarry Superstars Sports and Cultural Club (in this Act referred to as “the Club”) is hereby created a body corporate.

Aims and objects **3.** The aims and objects of the Club are—

- (a) to participate in cricket, football, all fours and other sporting activities;
- (b) to encourage and display fellowship, good conduct and sportsmanship at all times;
- (c) to raise funds by special projects to defray expenditure of the Club;
- (d) to participate in community work and render services to the needy, whenever and wherever possible;
- (e) to educate members in democratic procedures;
- (f) to provide recreation for members;
- (g) to do all such other things as are necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above aims and objects.

Powers of the Club **4.** The Club may—

- (a) acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;

- (b) accept surrenders of reconveyances and enter into contracts;
- (c) sell, exchange, demise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in it subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title.

5. All real or personal property of whatever nature now held by or vested in, any person for the use and benefit of the Club is hereby transferred to and vested in the Club. Transfer and vesting of property

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Club shall be sealed with the common seal of the Club in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office (or in the event of incapacity in the presence of some other person or persons authorised for that purpose by the Club) who shall both sign every document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the seal is the lawful seal of the Club. Mode of execution of documents

7. (1) The Club shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Club and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be. Service of documents

(2) Every document to be served on the Club may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post, to the registered address of the Club.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Club liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction thereof.

Power to make rules

8. The Club may from time to time make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions and such rules may be amended from time to time.

Saving of State and other rights

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
