**Act No. 25 of 1965**

AN ACT to provide for the incorporation of the Advisory Board of Unity of Trinidad and Tobago and for matters incidental thereto.

*[Assented to 6th November, 1965].*

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, Enactment  
by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and  
House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and  
by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Advisory Board of Short title  
Unity of Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1965.

## Interpretation

2. For the purposes of this Act "the Advisory Board" means the Advisory Board of Unity of Trinidad and Tobago comprising of the Reverend Norman Denis Robinson of Blue Range, Diego Martin, Alfred Earle Jones of Trinidad Crescent, Federation Park, Ovita Creese of 22, Industry Lane, Belmont, Earl Harewood, 60, First Street, San Juan, Melville Roach of 15A, Sandhurst Street, Belmont, Harold Alexander Mapp of 30, Eighth Street, Barataria and Donat Need of 328, Wizeman Avenue, Diego Martin.

Incorporation  
of Trustees

3. The Advisory Board is hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Advisory Board of Unity of Trinidad and Tobago".

Power to  
borrow money  
and give  
mortgages

4. The Advisory Board may, subject to the Rules of Unity of Trinidad and Tobago, from time to time—

- (a) borrow money and for the repayment of the same by deed under its seal, give and execute mortgages, charges, pledges or other securities through real or personal property, or make any such arrangements as it may consider expedient, with such covenants, powers and provisions as it may think proper; and
- (b) advance money on the security on any freehold or leasehold property, accept surrenders and recovenants.

Registration  
and address  
for services  
of documents  
and manner

5. (1) The Advisory Board shall at all times have a fixed address for the services of documents and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General.

(2) Any document may be served on the Advisory Board by leaving the same at or by sending the same by post to the address registered under subsection (1).

Mode of

6. All deeds, documents, and other instruments requiring the seal of the Advisory Board shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of two of the members of the Advisory Board who shall sign every such deed, document or other instrument to which the common seal is affixed.

7. The Advisory Board may make such rules as appear <sup>Power to</sup> to them necessary for carrying out the purpose of <sup>make rules</sup> Unity of Trinidad and Tobago, and, in particular, but without limiting the generality of the foregoing, make rules providing for:—

- (a) the government of Unity of Trinidad and Tobago;
- (b) the qualification, election and functions of members of Unity of Trinidad and Tobago;
- (c) the appointment and duties of the officers of Unity of Trinidad and Tobago.

8. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect <sup>Saving of</sup> the rights of Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and <sup>Crown and</sup> Successors, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any <sup>other rights</sup> other persons except such as are mentioned in this Act, and those claiming by, from or under them.
