THE CUSTOMS ACT, CHAP. 78:01

ORDER

MADE BY THE PRESIDENT UNDER SECTION 44 OF THE  
CUSTOMS ACT

THE CUSTOMS (REVOCATION OF PROHIBITION) ORDER, 1993

WHEREAS it is provided by section 44 of the Customs Act, Chap. 78:01 (formerly section 38 of the Customs Ordinance, Ch. 32: No. 2) *inter alia*, that the President may by Order (formerly by Proclamation) prohibit the importation of any goods whatsoever either absolutely or conditionally:

And whereas on the 22nd day of November, 1949 the acting Governor of the then Colony of Trinidad and Tobago issued a Proclamation (No. 15 of 1949) published in the *Gazette* as Government Notice No. 212 of 1949 prohibiting the importation in bottles or similar receptacles of brandy, whisky, gin or rum of a greater strength than fifteen degrees under-proof as ascertained by Sike's hydrometer or analytical test:

And whereas circumstances have arisen that warrant the revocation of the said prohibition:

Now, therefore, I, NOOR MOHAMED HASSANALI, President, as aforesaid make the following Order—
