THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, CH. 32. No. 2
REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 254 OF THE
CUSTOMS ORDINANCE

THE CUSTOMS OFFICERS (OVERTIME) (AMENDMENT)
REGULATIONS, 1960

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs Officers (Overtime) (Amendment) Regulations, 1960, and shall be read as one with the Customs Officers (Overtime) Regulations, 1957, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 4 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended:—

- (a) in paragraph (1) thereof by substituting for the word "The" occurring at the commencement thereof the words "Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this regulation the"; and
- (b) in paragraph (2) thereof by substituting for the first seven lines thereof the following:—

"In computing the hours of duty to be credited to officers mentioned in paragraph (1) of this regulation the following provisions shall apply—

- (a) for every public holiday, in addition to any work actually performed, eight hours duty shall be credited except when the public holiday falls on a Saturday when four hours shall be credited;"

3. Paragraph (1) (a) of regulation 5 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended:—

(a) by inserting the words, "overtime fees for," immediately before the words "one hour" occurring in the third line of the first proviso thereto; and

(b) by substituting for the second proviso thereto the following:—

"Provided further that an officer who works, or is summoned for, overtime duty commencing later than one hour after the termination of his normal hours of duty for the day set out in regulation 3 of these Regulations shall be paid a minimum of two hours' overtime."
