THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, CH. 32. No. 2

REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 254 OF THE
CUSTOMS ORDINANCE

THE CUSTOMS OFFICERS (OVERTIME) (AMENDMENT)
REGULATIONS, 1961

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs Officers (Overtime) (Amendment) Regulations, 1961, and shall be read as one with the Customs Officers (Overtime) Regulations, 1957, as amended by the Customs Officers (Overtime) (Amendment) Regulations, 1960, and hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 5 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by substituting therefor the following :—

“5. (1) There shall be paid to Officers for duties performed outside or in excess of the hours set out in these Regulations the following rates of overtime fees—

(a) On ordinary Week-days and on Saturdays—

Guards, Guards-Mechanic and Chief Guard	}	\$1.30 for each hour or part thereof:
Customs and Excise Officers and Supervisors		
	}	\$2.85 for each hour or part thereof:

On Sundays and Public Holidays—

Guards, Guards-Mechanic and Chief Guard	}	\$1.30 for each hour or part thereof for the first eight hours and \$1.75 for each hour or part thereof thereafter:
Customs and Excise Officers and Supervisors		
	}	\$2.85 for each hour or part thereof for the first eight hours and \$3.80 for each hour or part thereof thereafter:

Provided that on Sundays and on Public Holidays and Saturdays after 1 p.m. and on other days between 5.00 p.m. and 6.00 a.m. overtime fees for one hour in excess of the actual time occupied in performing the service required shall be paid to each Officer employed so as to cover the time spent in travelling to and from the place of employment :

Provided further that an Officer who works, or is summoned for, overtime duty commencing later than one hour after the termination of his normal hours of duty for the day set out in regulation 3 of these Regulations shall be paid a minimum of two hours' overtime.

(2) The fees specified in subparagraphs (b) to (e) inclusive of paragraph (1) of this regulation shall be in lieu of the fees specified in paragraph (a) of the said paragraph."
