THE ELECTIONS AND BOUNDARIES COMMISSION (LOCAL
GOVERNMENT) (TOBAGO HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY) ORDER,
2004

WHEREAS under section 71 of the Constitution of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago there is established an Elections and Boundaries Commission (hereinafter referred to as “the Commission”):^{Chap. 1:01}

And whereas under subsection (1) of section 4 of the Elections and Boundaries Commission (Local Government) Act (hereinafter referred to as “the Act”), it is provided *inter alia* that the Commission shall define and review the boundaries of the electoral districts into which an electoral area is, or is to be, divided and shall submit to the Minister reports either—^{Chap. 22:50}

- (a) “showing the constituencies into which it recommends that an electoral area should be divided in order to give effect to the Rules set out in the Second Schedule”; or
- (b) “stating that, in the opinion of the Commission, no alteration is required to the existing number or boundaries or electoral districts in order to give effect to the said Rules”:

And whereas in accordance with subsection (1)(a) of the said section 4 of the Act, the Commission, on the 23rd day of August, 2004 submitted to the Minister a report in which it recommends that for the purposes of elections to the Tobago House of Assembly, the boundaries of the electoral districts into which the electoral area mentioned in Part III of the First Schedule to the Act is divided, should be as defined in the Schedule to this Order:

And whereas by subsection (3) of section 4 of the Act, it is provided that as soon as may be after the Commission has submitted a report under subsection (1)(a), the Minister shall lay before the House of Representatives for its approval, the draft of an Order by the President for giving effect, whether with or without modification, to the recommendations contained in the report:

And whereas a draft of this Order giving effect to the recommendations contained in the Eighth Report of the Commission was laid before the House of Representatives for its approval by the Minister on the 29th day of October, 2004 and was approved by resolution of the House of Representatives on the 5th day of November, 2004:

SCHEDULE

EIGHTH REPORT OF THE ELECTIONS AND BOUNDARIES COMMISSION ON ITS DEFINITION AND REVIEW OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ELECTORAL DISTRICTS IN THE ELECTORAL AREA OF TOBAGO

To: The Honourable Rennie Dumas,
Minister of Local Government,

1. We respectfully submit to you the Eighth Report of the Elections and Boundaries Commission (the Commission) on its definition and review of the boundaries of the electoral districts in the electoral area of Tobago. This is done in accordance with section 4 of the Elections and Boundaries Commission (Local Government) Act, Chap. 25:50 (the Act) which provides, *inter alia*, as follows:

- “ 4. (1) The Commission shall define and review the boundaries of the electoral districts into which an electoral area is, or is to be, divided and shall submit to the Minister reports either—
- (a) showing the constituencies into which it recommends that an electoral area should be divided in order to give effect to the Rules set out in the Second Schedule; or
 - (b) stating that, in the opinion of the Commission, no alteration is required to the existing number or boundaries of electoral districts in order to give effect to the said rules.
- (2) Reports under subsection (1) shall be submitted by the Commission—
- (c) in the case of a report in reference to Tobago, not less than two nor more than four years from the date of submission of the last report.”.

2. The Commission's last Report on the electoral area of Tobago was submitted to the Honourable Minister of Local Government on 24th August, 2000. Consequently, the deadline for the presentation of the instant report is 23rd August, 2004. The last election to the Tobago House of Assembly was held on 29th January, 2001. In the normal course, therefore, the next election thereto becomes due not later than three months after the dissolution of the Assembly in January, 2005 as is prescribed by section 22 of the Tobago House of Assembly Act (No. 40 of 1996).

3. For present purposes, as a consequence of the conjoint effect of Part III of the First Schedule of the Act and its other provisions as amended, as well as by the amendments introduced thereto by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1990, the relevant provisions which apply to the electoral area of Tobago are as follows:

- (1) Tobago is divided into twelve electoral districts; and
- (2) The Commission may in consideration of Rule 3 of the Second Schedule of the Act vary the number of electors in any electoral district "provided that in no case shall the number of electors in any one electoral district of an electoral area exceed or be less than the number of electors in any other electoral district of that electoral area by more than twenty-five per cent".

Rule 3 referred to above, provides as follows:

"In the division of electoral districts in regional electoral areas natural boundaries such as major highways and rivers shall be used wherever possible."

4. For the purpose of considering its recommendations, the commission compared the electorates of 2000 and 2004. The relevant data are set out in the table attached hereto and marked Appendix A. They reveal, *inter alia*, that—

- (a) the electorate in the 12 electoral districts of Tobago rose from 36,995 to 38,142, an increase of 1,147;
- (b) the highest electorate is 3,601;
- (c) the lowest electorate is 2,693;
- (d) the highest electorate exceeds the lowest by 33.7 per cent (%);
- (e) the lowest electorate being 2,693, the maximum electorate permissible is 3,366;
- (f) the following four (4) electoral districts (the first three (3) of which are concentrated in the south-west of Tobago) are above the maximum permissible:

5. Consequently, adjustments to the four electoral districts specified at 4(f) *supra* became necessary to bring them within the maximum twenty-five per cent above the lowest electorate as prescribed by the Rules. Because of the concentration of these electoral districts in the south-west of the island, in contrast with the electoral district in the north-east which had the lowest electorate, these adjustments unavoidably precipitated a ripple effect, giving rise to changes in a number of electoral districts, in

order to comply with the Rules. For the purpose of executing this exercise and formulating its recommendations, the Commission guided itself firstly, by the relevant principles and directions contained in the Rules including the requirement that "natural boundaries such as major highways and rivers shall be used wherever possible"; and secondly, by basic considerations such as compactness, contiguity, clarity of descriptions, the preservation of communities, access to polling stations, and the desirability of keeping adjustments to a minimum and ensuring their reasonableness in all the circumstances.

6. Guided by these considerations, the Commission examined the electoral district of Canaan/Bon Accord at the south-western extremity of Tobago with an electorate of 3,589 and decided that it would be reasonable, and we so recommend, that Polling Division No. 4852 with an electorate of 411 be transferred to the adjoining electoral district of Buccoo/Lambeau. The electorate of Canaan/Bon Accord will then be reduced to 3,178, and thus be brought within the permissible maximum.

7. In the result, the electorate in Buccoo/Lambeau will be increased by 411 to 3,883 which is 517 above the permissible maximum. Because of the factors referred to in paragraph 5 ante, the Commission recommends the transfer of not only Polling Division 4887 with an electorate of 644 but also Polling Division 4885 with an electorate of 338 to the electoral district of Scarborough/Signal Hill. Consequently, the community of Lambeau falls outside this electoral district and therefore, the Commission recommends that the name of the electoral district be changed to Buccoo/Mt. Pleasant. This electoral district will have an electorate of 2,901 which is within the permissible maximum.

8. The electoral district of Bethel/Patience Hill with an electorate of 3,480 was 114 above the maximum permissible. The Commission recommends the transfer of Polling Division 4880 with an electorate of 768 to the electoral district of Scarborough/Signal Hill and the inclusion from the electoral district of Black Rock/Whim of Polling Division 4870 with an electorate of 614 bringing the electorate in the electoral district of Bethel/Patience Hill to 3,326 which is within the permissible maximum. Since this will result in the removal of the Patience Hill community from the electoral district, the Commission recommends that the name of the electoral district be changed to Bethel/Mt. Irvine.

9. The Commission next turned its attention to Scarborough/Signal Hill. Consequent on the previous recommendations, Polling Divisions 4880, 4885 and 4887 with electorates of 768, 338 and 644 respectively, would be transferred to this electoral district. Adding the above electorate to that already in the electoral district of Scarborough/Signal Hill will bring the electorate there to 5,091, exceeding the permissible maximum by 1,725. The Commission therefore recommends the transfer of Polling Divisions 4890 and 4892 with electorates of 478 and 270 respectively, to the electoral district of Black Rock/Whim and simultaneously the transfer of Polling Divisions 4900 and 4901 with electorates of 578 and 431 respectively, to the electoral district of Mason Hall/Providence/Calder Hall. This would leave an electorate of 3,334 in the electoral district. Since these changes will include the Lambeau community and exclude the Scarborough community from the electoral district, the Commission is of the view that the name Lambeau/Signal Hill more accurately represents the composition of the electoral district and recommends that the name be changed accordingly.

10. Consequent on the previously proposed recommendations, that is, moving Polling Divisions 4890 and 4892 from Scarborough/Signal Hill to Black Rock/Whim and Polling Division 4870 from Black Rock/Whim to Bethel/Patience Hill, the electoral district of Black Rock/Whim ended up with an electorate of 3,345 which is below the maximum permissible. The community of Spring Garden is now included in the electoral district and the Commission recommends that the name of the electoral district be changed from Black Rock/Whim to Black Rock/Whim/Spring Garden.

11. Earlier recommendations included the transfer of Polling Divisions 4900 and 4901 into the electoral district of Mason Hall/Providence/Calder Hall which previously had the highest electorate of 3,601. To bring the electorate of this electoral district below the permissible maximum, the Commission recommends the transfer of Polling Divisions 4906 and 4946 with electorates of 450 and 720 respectively, to the electoral district of Moriah/Parlatuvier and at the same time the transfer of Polling Division 4947 with an electorate of 233 to the electoral district of Bacolet/Mount St. George. This would leave an electorate of 3,207 in the electoral district. The Commission further recommends that since the community of Scarborough will as a consequence be integrally a part of the electoral district and the communities of Mason Hall and Providence have been moved to the neighbouring electoral district of Moriah/Parlatuvier, the name Scarborough/Calder Hall more succinctly represents the composition of the electoral district and the Commission so recommends.

12. With the transfer of Polling Divisions 4906 and 4946 to the electoral district of Moriah/Parlatuvier, as recommended in the previous paragraph, this electoral district will have an electorate of 4,006. Thus, to bring the electorate in this electoral district below the permissible maximum, the Commission recommends the transfer of Polling Divisions 4985 and 4990 with electorates of 432 and 249 respectively, to the electoral district of l'Anse Fourmi/Speyside. Consequently, this electoral district with an electorate of 3,325 will now include the communities of Mason Hall and Providence and exclude the community of Parlatuvier. The Commission therefore recommends renaming the electoral district Providence/Mason Hall/Moriah.

13. The electoral district of l'Anse Fourmi/Speyside previously contained the lowest electorate. Transferring the adjacent Polling Divisions 4985 and 4990 to it brought the electorate to slightly above the permissible maximum. The Commission recommends the transfer of Polling Division 5025 with an electorate of 276 to the neighbouring electoral district of Roxborough/Delaforde. Since the community of Parlatuvier will as a consequence be an integral part of the electoral district the Commission recommends redesignating the electoral district Parlatuvier/l'Anse Fourmi/Speyside which will have an electorate of 3,098.

14. With an addition of 276 electors from Polling Division 5025 from l'Anse Fourmi/Speyside the electorate of Roxborough/Delaforde now stood at 3,060. Since this was within the permissible band, no further adjustment was necessary. Similarly, with the addition of 233 electors from Polling Division 4947 from Mason Hall/Providence/Calder Hall the electorate of Bacolet/Mount St. George became 2,961. Since this was within the permissible band, no further adjustment was necessary.

15. No adjustments were necessary to the electoral districts of Plymouth/Golden Lane and Belle Garden/Goodwood and none were made.

16. What the Commission proposes therefore, for the reasons given, may be conveniently summarised thus:

(a) Of the twelve electoral districts in Tobago adjustments should be made to the boundaries of all but two of them, namely:

Plymouth/Golden Lane and Belle Garden/Goodwood;

(b) The names of seven electoral districts should be changed as follows:

Buccoo/Lambeau to Buccoo/Mount Pleasant;

Bethel/Patience Hill to Bethel/Mt. Irvine;

Scarborough/Signal Hill to Lambeau/Signal Hill;

Black Rock/Whim to Black Rock/Whim/Spring Garden;

Mason Hall/Providence/Calder Hall to Scarborough/Calder Hall;
Moriah/Parlatuvier to Providence/Mason Hall/Moriah; and
l'Anse Fourmi/Speyside to Parlatuvier/l'Anse Fourmi/Speyside.

17. In order to give effect therefore to the Rules, set out in the Second Schedule of the Act, the Commission recommends as follows:

- (a) the twelve electoral districts prescribed by law for the electoral area of Tobago should carry the names as described and shown in Appendix B attached hereto;
- (b) each of the said districts should be defined as stated in the attachments to Appendix C; and
- (c) each of the electoral districts in the said electoral area of Tobago should be delineated as shown and defined as described in the composite map attached hereto and titled "Map of the Electoral Area of Tobago".

BOUNDARIES OF PROPOSED ELECTORAL DISTRICT

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BACOLET/MOUNT ST. GEORGE

Comprising the following Polling Divisions:

4915, 4920, 4921, 4925, 4935, 4947.

ELECTORATE—2,961

(In the following boundary descriptions, wherever a boundary line is described as passing along a road, street, avenue, trace or other roadway, the centre line of such road, street, avenue, trace or other roadway is indicated. Wherever ownership is indicated by name, it should be interpreted as referring to the current or previous ownership of such land.)

NORTH —From the point where Belmont Road crosses the western boundary of Belmont Estate proceeding in a generally easterly direction along Belmont Road to its junction with Belmont Trace; thence proceeding eastwards along an imaginary line to the east bank of the Hillsborough West River; thence in a generally north-easterly direction along the east bank of the Hillsborough West River to the northern boundary of lands of Claxton John; thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said lands to the northern boundary of Greenhill Estate; thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the said estate to its north-eastern corner; thence proceeding eastwards along an imaginary line to the point on Mount St. George-Castara Road.

EAST —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction along Mount St. George-Castara Road to its junction with Windward Road; thence southwards along an imaginary line to the point on the sea coast at Hillsborough Bay.

SOUTH —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction along the said sea coast to the mouth of the Cook's River.

WEST —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally northerly and then north-easterly direction along the east bank of the Cook's River to the point where it is crossed by Northside Connector Road; thence southwards along the Northside Connector Road to Sargeant Cain Trace; thence eastwards, southwards, and again eastwards along Sargeant Cain Trace to Calder Hall Road; thence in a generally northerly direction along Calder Hall Road to Friendsfield Road; thence in a generally easterly direction along Friendsfield Road to French Fort Local Road; thence in a generally easterly and then northerly direction along French Fort Local Road to its eastern end; thence proceeding in a generally easterly direction along an imaginary line to the western boundary of the Hope Estate; thence in a generally north-easterly direction along the western boundary of the Hope Estate to the point where it abuts the south-western corner of the Belmont Estate; thence in a generally northerly direction along the western boundary of Belmont Estate to the point where it is crossed by the Belmont Road at the point of commencement.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BELLE GARDEN/GOODWOOD

Comprising the following Polling Divisions:

4930, 5050, 5055, 5060, 5065.

ELECTORATE—3,300

(In the following boundary descriptions, wherever a boundary line is described as passing along a road, street, avenue, trace or other roadway, the centre line of such road, street, avenue, trace or other roadway is indicated. Wherever ownership is indicated by name, it should be interpreted as referring to the current or previous ownership of such land.)

NORTH —From the point on the crest of the main ridge of hills at the northern end of Mount St. George-Castara Road proceeding in a generally easterly direction along the said ridge of hills to the point at the source of the Belle River.

EAST —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally southerly direction along the west bank of the Belle River to the point where it is crossed by Zion Hill Road; thence in a generally south-easterly direction along Zion Hill Road to Windward Road; thence south-eastwards along Windward Road to Belle Garden Bay Road; thence in a generally south-easterly direction along Belle Garden Bay Road to its southern end on the sea coast at Mangrove Bay.

SOUTH —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction along the said sea coast to the point where an imaginary line drawn southwards from the junction of the Mount St. George-Castara Road and Windward Road meets the sea coast at Hillsborough Bay.

WEST —From the last mentioned point proceeding northwards along the said imaginary line to the junction of Mount St. George-Castara Road and Windward Road; thence in a generally north-easterly and then north-westerly direction along Mount St. George-Castara Road to the point where it crosses the crest of the main ridge of hills at the point of commencement.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BETHEL/MT. IRVINE

Comprising the following Polling Divisions:

4865, 4866, 4870, 4875, 4876

ELECTORATE—3,326

(In the following boundary descriptions, wherever a boundary line is described as passing along a road, street, avenue, trace or other roadway, the centre line of such road, street, avenue, trace or other roadway is indicated. Wherever ownership of land is indicated by name, it should be interpreted as referring to the current or previous ownership of such land.)

NORTH —From the point on the sea coast where an imaginary line drawn westwards from
AND the western end of Courland Bush Trace meets it proceeding in a generally
EAST easterly direction along the said imaginary line to the western end of Courland Bush Trace; thence proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction along Courland Bush Trace to its junction with Grafton Road and Mount Hay Trace at L.P. #50; thence in a generally south-easterly direction along Mount Hay Trace to its junction with Orange Hill Road at the 3 Mile Mark; thence in a generally

southerly direction along an imaginary line to the point where an Estate Trace crosses the southern boundary of the Prospect Estate; thence in a generally south-westerly direction along the said Estate Trace passing through Riseland Estate to the point where it meets the north-eastern corner of the Sherwood Estate; thence in a generally southerly direction along the eastern boundary of the Sherwood Estate to its south-eastern corner where it abuts the Auchenskeoch-Buccoo Bay Road.

SOUTH —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally westerly direction along the Auchenskeoch-Buccoo Bay Road to Buccoo Road; thence in a generally westerly direction along Buccoo Road to its junction with Shirvan Road.

West —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally northerly direction along Shirvan Road to Grafton Road; thence in a generally north-easterly direction along Grafton Road to its junction with Orange Hill Road; thence in a generally westerly direction along an imaginary line to the point on the sea coast; thence in a generally northerly and then north-easterly direction along the said sea coast to the point where an imaginary line drawn westwards from the western end of Courland Bush Trace meets it at the point of commencement.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BLACK ROCK/WHIM/SPRING GARDEN

Comprising the following Polling Divisions:

4871, 4890, 4892, 4895, 4896, 4950, 4951.

ELECTORATE—3,345

(In the following boundary descriptions, wherever a boundary line is described as passing along a road, street, avenue, trace or other roadway, the centre line of such road, street, avenue, trace or other roadway is indicated. Wherever ownership of land is indicated by name, it should be interpreted as referring to the current or previous ownership of such land.)

NORTH —From the point on the sea coast at the mouth of the Courland River at Courland Bay proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction along the south bank of the Courland River to an Estate Trace which runs through the lands of Thomas Sandy and the Franklyn's Estate; thence in a generally north-easterly direction along the said Estate Trace passing through lands of Thomas Sandy and the Franklyn's Estate to Franklyn Road; thence in a generally northerly direction along Franklyn Road to Arnos Vale Road; thence in a generally north-easterly direction along Arnos Vale Road to its junction with Providence Road.

East —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally south-easterly, easterly and then southerly direction along Providence Road to its junction with Mt. Pellier Trace; thence in a generally westerly direction along Mt. Pellier Trace to its western end at L.P. #1; thence in a generally westerly direction along an imaginary line to the northern end of Logwood Park Trace; thence in a generally southerly and then westerly direction along Logwood Park Trace to Glen Road; thence in a generally north-westerly and then westerly direction along Glen Road to its junction with Plymouth Road at L.P. #30; thence in a generally south-easterly direction along Plymouth Road to its junction with Milford Road; thence in a generally southerly direction along an imaginary line to the point on the sea coast.

- SOUTH —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally south-westerly direction along the said sea coast to the point where an imaginary line drawn southwards from the junction of Milford Road and Orange Hill Road meets it.
- WEST —From the last mentioned point proceeding in a generally northerly direction along the said imaginary line to the junction of Milford Road and Orange Hill Road; thence in a generally north-westerly direction along Orange Hill Road to its junction with the Claude Noel Highway; thence in a generally north-easterly direction along the Claude Noel Highway to its junction with Spring Garden Trace Extension at L.P. #315, west of the Mt. 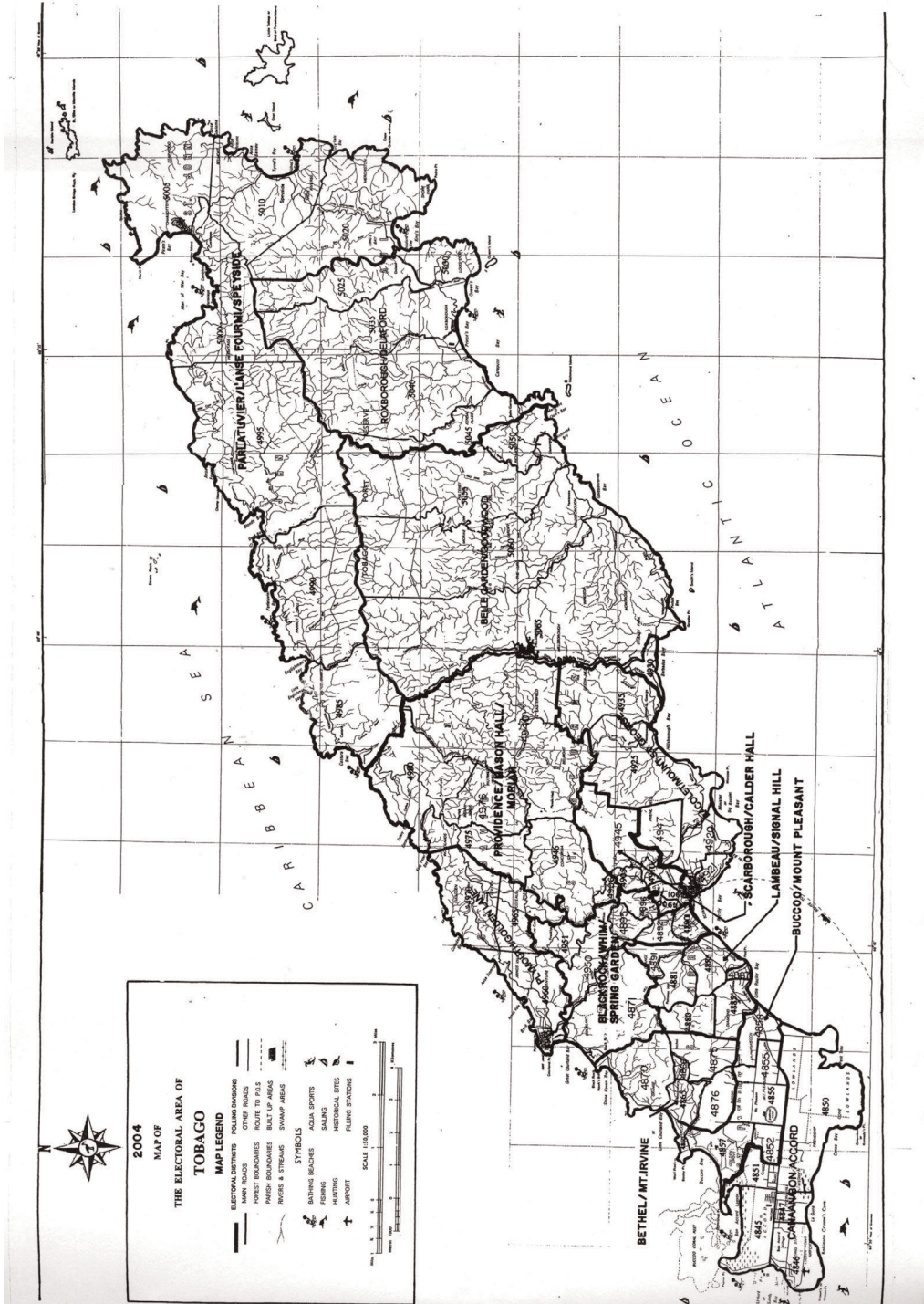
