AN ORDINANCE to amend the Forests Ordinance, 1915.

[13th March, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Forests (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922, and shall be read as one with the Forests Ordinance, 1915, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance. Short title and construction. (Ord. 42-1915.)

2. The following shall be inserted in section 2 of the Principal Ordinance after the definition of "Property mark":—

"Classification mark" means a mark placed on timber that already bears a property mark to denote its origin or the agency by which it has been handled.

Principal Ord. **5.** Paragraph (b) of section 23 of the Principal Ordinance
is hereby amended by inserting the words "property marks
and classification marks" in lieu of "property-marks" in
the first line, and by inserting the words "property mark
or classification mark" in lieu of "property-marks" in
the fourth line.
