AN ORDINANCE to amend the law relating to Pensions.

[20th April, 1944:]

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions Short title,
Ordinance, 1944.

Section 13 of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943, repealed and replaced. No. 33 of 1943.

2. Section 13 of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943, is hereby repealed and replaced by the following section :—

Ch. 9. No. 6. "Limitation of application.

13. This Ordinance shall not have effect in relation to any case in which pension privileges, gratuities or other allowances fall to be awarded or have been awarded thereunder by reason of the officer in question having ceased to be in the public service before the commencement of this Ordinance : Provided that the new section 9B of the Principal Ordinance shall apply in the case of all non-commissioned officers or constables to whom the circumstances contemplated by subsection (2) of that section become applicable hereafter or have become applicable since the 29th of November, 1942 : Provided further that the new subsection (6) of section 11 of the Principal Ordinance, as enacted in section 6 of this Ordinance, and the new regulation 4 of the Pensions Regulations, 1938, as enacted by section 12 of this Ordinance, shall apply in the case of all female officers who hereafter retire, or who have retired since the 1st of June, 1941, from the service of the Government in the circumstances contemplated by those provisions."

Passed in Council this twelfth day of April, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-four.
