1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions (Amend- Short title
ment) Ordinance, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Ch. 9. No. 6
Pensions Ordinance, in this Ordinance referred to as the
Principal Ordinance.

2. Subsection (3) of section 12 of the Principal Ordinance and the marginal note thereto are hereby repealed and replaced by the following:—

“Officer whose
service is
terminated in
the public
interest in
certain
circumstances
may be
retired

(3) Where an officer's service is terminated on the ground that having regard to the conditions of the public service, the usefulness of the officer thereto and all the other circumstances of the case, such termination is desirable in the public interest, and a pension, gratuity or other allowance cannot otherwise be granted to him under the provisions of this Ordinance, the Governor in Council may, if he thinks fit, grant such pension, gratuity or other allowance as he thinks just and proper, not exceeding in amount that for which the officer would be eligible if he retired from the public service by reason of some infirmity of mind or body likely to be permanent in the circumstances described in subsection (1) of this section.”

Passed in Council this twenty-second day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-four.
