AN ORDINANCE to amend the Registration of Electors
(Legislative Council) Ordinance, 1925.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

Short title.
Construction.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Registration of
Electors (Legislative Council) (Amendment) Ordinance,
1934, and shall be read as one with the Registration of
Electors (Legislative Council) Ordinance, hereinafter called
the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance (as amended by
the Registration of Electors (Legislative Council)
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1930), is hereby repealed, and
the following section substituted in lieu thereof :

3.—(1) In the year 1936 and thereafter in such years as the Governor by proclamation may appoint, in no case being more than five years after the date of the last preceding general election of members of the Legislative Council, a register shall be compiled in each district of all persons entitled under the provisions of the Order in Council to vote at the election of a member of the Legislative Council for such district. Compiling registers of electors.

(2) Where a district consists of more than one Ward, the register shall be compiled in separate parts for each Ward, and each Ward may be sub-divided into such polling districts as the Governor may by Proclamation appoint.

(3) Where a Ward has been sub-divided into polling districts, the register shall in respect of such Ward be compiled in as many parts as there are polling districts.

(4) Each register compiled in accordance with this Ordinance shall come into force on the next ensuing first day of January and shall remain in force until the register next compiled comes into force.

(5) If for any reason a registration officer fails to compile a fresh register for any district or Ward, the register in force when the fresh register should have come into force shall continue in operation as the register for such district or Ward.
