AN ORDINANCE to amend the Post Office Ordinance.

[9th December, 1926.]

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Post Office Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, and shall be read as one with the Post Office Ordinance, hereinafter called the Cap. 108. Principal Ordinance.
- 2. Sections 7, 9 and 27 (3) of the Principal Ordinance Amendment are hereby amended by the deletion of the words "with the of ss. 7, 9 and sanction and approval of His Majesty's Postmaster-General."
- 3. Section 40 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment amended by the deletion of the words "and with the Cap. 108. sanction of His Majesty's Postmaster-General."

Sending opium &c., by post.

4. Paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section 55 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting after the words "deleterious substance" in the third line the words "any opium, morphine, cocaine or other narcotic."

Counterfeiting international and postal identity cards.

5. The following shall be inserted as section 56A of the reply coupons Principal Ordinance:—

56A. Every person who fraudulently

- (a) counterfeits an international reply coupon or postal identity card; or
- (b) uses any counterfeit international reply coupon or postal identity card

shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Amendment of s. 58 of Cap. 108.

6. Section 58 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the words "or impression of a postal franking machine" after the word "stamp" wherever it occurs in the section.

Rules and regulations.

- 7. Section 72 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:
 - 72. (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council to make such rules and regulations as he may deem proper for carrying into effect the provisions of this Ordinance for postal service within the Colony, and, subject to the provisions of any Treaty or Convention with any State or States binding on the Government of the Colony, for postal service outside the Colony.
 - (2) All such rules and regulations shall be published in the Royal Gazette.

(3) All rules and regulations made under this Ordinance shall be laid before the Legislative Council for approval, and when so approved shall have the same force and effect as if they were contained in this Ordinance.
