AN ORDINANCE to amend the Summary Convictions (offences) Ordinance, 1921, in regard to false alarms of fire.

[ 8<sup>th</sup> November, 1921.]

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Convictions (offences) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1921, and shall be read as one with the Summary Convictions (offences) Ordinance, 1921, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance. Short title and construction.

2. The following shall be inserted as section 118A of the Principal Ordinance:— Penalty for giving false alarm of fire.

118A. Every person knowingly giving or causing to be given a false alarm of fire to any fire brigade or to any officer or member thereof or to any constable, whether by means of a street fire alarm, statement, message, or otherwise, shall be liable on summary conviction by a magistrate to a fine not exceeding £20.
