AN ORDINANCE to amend the Summary Convictions (offences) Ordinance, 1921, in regard to false alarms of fire.

[ 8 = November, 1921.]

E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Con-Short title victions (offences) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1921, and shall and construction. be read as one with the Summary Convictions (offences) Ordinance, 1921, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.
- 2. The following shall be inserted as section 118A of the Penalty for Principal Ordinance:—
  - 118A. Every person knowingly giving or causing to be given a false alarm of fire to any fire brigade or to any officer or member thereof or to any constable, whether by means of a street fire alarm, statement, message, or otherwise, shall be liable on summary conviction by a magistrate to a fine not exceeding £20.
