AN ORDINANCE to amend the Botanic Gardens Ordinance, No. 130.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Botanic Gardens Ordinance, 1908.

2. The definition of "the Gardens" in Section 2 of the Botanic Gardens Ordinance (No. 130) and the Botanic Gardens (Amendment) Ordinance (No. 239) are hereby repealed, and the following shall be read as part of Section 2 of the said Ordinance No. 130:—

"The Gardens" means the Royal Botanic Gardens as delineated and set forth coloured pink and comprised within the line marked with the letters A to W in a certain plan dated the 8th day of July 1903, signed by Charles Style Cochrane, Esquire, Engineer in charge of Surveys, and deposited in the Office of the Sub-Intendant of Crown Lands; and includes lands in addition to those delineated in the said plan which may from time to time be acquired

or appropriated with the sanction of the Governor and Legislative Council for any experimental plantation or for the cultivation of any vegetable products under the direction of the Superintendent.

Passed in Council this Third day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eight.
