AN ORDINANCE to amend the Cinematograph Ordinance,
Ch. 30. No. 10.

[19th November, 1949]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cinematograph (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Cinematograph Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Section 20
of Principal

2. Section 20 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting the words "any of the provisions of this Ordinance" for the words "the provisions of this Ordinance or the regulations made thereunder"; and by adding immediately after the words "shall be" the words "guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and".

3. Section 21 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the words "or the Superintendent of Fire Brigades or any member of a Fire Brigade appointed by him" immediately after the words "appointed by him" and the words "appointed as aforesaid" respectively.

4. Section 22 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the words "or under any regulations made under this Ordinance" immediately after the words "this Ordinance".

Section 23 (r)
of Principal

amended.

5. Subsection (1) of section 23 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended:—

(a) by substituting the following for the first paragraph thereof—

"The Governor in Council may make regulations for prescribing anything which under this Ordinance is to be prescribed, generally for carrying this Ordinance into effect, and determining offences against any of the said regulations and penalties therefor and in particular as to—";

(b) by deleting paragraph (i);

(c) by adding the following proviso at the end of the subsection:—

"Provided that no penalty for an offence against any of the said regulations shall exceed a fine of five thousand dollars or imprisonment for twelve months with or without hard labour: Provided further that in the case of a continuing offence any such regulations may provide for a further penalty of one hundred dollars for each day during which the offence continues."

Passed in Council this fourth day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.
