A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 2 of the Country Markets Ordinance, Ch. 40. No. 4, it is provided *inter alia* that it shall be lawful for the Governor-General from time to time, by proclamation, to declare any premises, not being within the limits of any borough, to be a public market:

And whereas it is expedient that the premises described in the Schedule hereto, not being within the limits of a borough, should be declared to be a public market:

Now, therefore, I, SOLOMON HOCHOY, Governor-General as aforesaid, hereby declare the premises described in the Schedule hereto to be a public market to be known as the Scarborough Central Market, with effect from the 11th day of December, 1971.

SCHEDULE

The premises situate at Scarborough in the parish of St. Andrew in the Ward of Tobago and bounded as follows:—

North — Crown Lands
South — Lands of Brewster Romeo
East — Crown Lands
West — Wilson Road
