

LEGAL NOTICE No. 141

REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 1990

ORDER

MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE UNDER REGULATION 4 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF.

THE CURFEW ORDER, 1990

1. This Order may be cited as the Curfew Order, 1990.

2. This Order applies to the areas described in the Schedules and such areas as are declared Curfew Areas for the purpose of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1990.

3. Subject to the exemptions hereinafter provided, no person shall be out of doors in the areas and at the times specified in the Schedules without a permit in writing of the Commissioner of Police or such other person or authority as may be authorised by him for the purpose; and any such permission may be granted subject to such conditions as may be specified therein.

4. Any person shall be exempted from the requirement to be in possession of a permit, who, on being required so to do by any police officer or member of the Defence Force in uniform, produces evidence that he is—

(a) a police officer or member of the Defence Force who is on duty;

(b) a person who is the holder of a permit as mentioned in paragraph 3.

FIRST SCHEDULE

At any time in the Port-of-Spain area bounded—

(a) on the North by Park Street;

(b) on the West by Richmond Street;

(c) on the South by Independence Square; and

(d) on the East by Charlotte Street.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Between 3.00 p.m. and 1.00 p.m. on the day following, in Port-of-Spain in the area bounded—

- (a) on the North by St. Clair Avenue and Queen's Park West;
- (b) on the South by Tragarete Road;
- (c) on the East by Woodford Street; and
- (d) on the West by Alexandra Street.

THIRD SCHEDULE

In the remainder of Trinidad and Tobago between the hours of 6.00 p.m. and 6.00 a.m. on the day following.
