AN ACT to amend the Criminal Procedure Ordinance,
Ch. 4. No. 3.

[Assented to 20th March, 1970]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, ^{Enactment}
by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and
House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and
by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Criminal Procedure ^{Short title}
(Amendment) Act, 1970.

2. The Criminal Procedure Ordinance is amended by substituting for the Second Schedule thereto, the following:

“SECOND SCHEDULE

The fees and expenses to counsel and solicitor assigned to any prisoner under section 39 of this Ordinance shall be as follows:—

There shall be allowed to counsel a fee of \$250 and to the solicitor a fee of \$175; but the presiding Judge after the conclusion of the trial, may, if he thinks fit, certify that the case was one of unusual length or difficulty, and thereupon the fee may be increased to such sum as he may direct but not exceeding to counsel \$500 and to the solicitor \$350.

In addition to such fees counsel and solicitor may be allowed subject to taxation thereof by the Registrar any out-of-pocket expenses actually and reasonably incurred.”
