ORDER

MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE UNDER SECTION 44F(1) OF THE
MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE

THE TRAFFIC RESTRICTION (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS)
(BEETHAM AND CHURCHILL-ROOSEVELT HIGHWAYS
DIVERSION) ORDER, 1980

1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Restriction (Temporary Provisions) (Beetham and Churchill-Roosevelt Highways Diversion) Order, 1980. Citation

2. This Order shall have effect between the hours of 6.00 a.m. and 9.00 a.m. on the following days:— Commence-
ment and
cessation

Friday, 7th March, 1980—Monday, 31st March, 1980;
exclusive of Saturdays and Sundays.

3. (1) Vehicular traffic shall proceed along the Churchill-Roosevelt Highway, from Don Miguel Road to Wallerfield in an easterly or westerly direction. Two-way
traffic

(2) Vehicular traffic shall proceed along Aranguez Road in a northerly and southerly direction.

4. Vehicular traffic shall proceed along the portion of the Churchill-Roosevelt Highway, between Don Miguel Road and the Barataria Roundabout in a westerly direction only. One-way
traffic

5. No vehicular traffic on the undermentioned roads shall turn right onto the Churchill-Roosevelt Highway— No right
turn

- (a) Don Miguel Road;
- (b) El Socorro Extension Road;
- (c) Boundary Road;
- (d) Chootoo Trace;
- (e) Cyrus Trace;
- (f) Chanka Trace Extension.

6. (1) A person driving or propelling a vehicle on any road to which this Order applies, shall comply with the rules for diversion of traffic contained in this paragraph in addition to such other directions as may be given to him by any Police officer in uniform in the execution of his duty, when engaged in the regulation of traffic on such a road. Rules for

(2) All vehicles proceeding from the Barataria/San Juan areas on the Churchill-Roosevelt Highway shall proceed as follows:—

- (a) South along Jogie Road, onto Don Miguel Road and thence to the East-Bound Carriageway of the Churchill-Roosevelt Highway;
- (b) South along El Socorro Road to the East-Bound carriageway of the Churchill-Roosevelt Highway; and
- (c) South along Aranguetz Road to the East-Bound carriageway of the Churchill-Roosevelt Highway.

7. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of this Order, may be removed by the Police and impounded and dealt with in accordance with sections 78B and 78C of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance.
