Act No. 46 of 1975

[L.S.]

AN ACT for the incorporation of The Christian Fellowship
Assembly of Trinidad and Tobago.

[Assented to 2nd October, 1975]

WHEREAS "The Christian Fellowship Assembly" a religious ^{Preamble} association, has for some time been propagating the Gospel in Trinidad and Tobago.

And whereas it is expedient that the association should be incorporated for the purpose of pursuing its aims and objects and for doing such things as are hereinafter set forth.

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as The Christian Fellowship Assembly of Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1975.

**Incorporation of
the Assembly**

2. The association known as "The Christian Fellowship Assembly of Trinidad and Tobago" shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have a legal personality separate and distinct from its members and, or, adherents, perpetual succession, use a common seal which may from time to time be changed in accordance with the rules of the said body corporate, and may sue and be sued in the Courts of Justice of Trinidad and Tobago. The said body corporate is hereinafter referred to in this Act as "The Assembly".

**Aims and
objects of
the Assembly**

3. The aims and objects of the Assembly are:

- (a) to promote absolute faith in and obedience to God through his son Jesus Christ, as revealed by the Holy Spirit in the Scriptures;
- (b) to preach and teach all the divine virtues, attributes and requirements of pure religion especially faith, charity, temperance, peacefulness, love and understanding according to the teachings of Our Lord Jesus Christ;
- (c) to print, publish and distribute Christian Literature for the enlightenment of all and to make known the word of God by means of all other media of communication;
- (d) to co-operate with other religious bodies whose aims and objects are not inconsistent with our own;
- (e) to give spiritual and material aid to the sick, the needy, the distressed, disabled and the deserted as far as within our power lies;
- (f) to establish institutions for the educational and physical well-being of all peoples.

4. All documents requiring the Seal of the Assembly shall be sealed with its Common Seal in the presence of two (2) of the Trustees for the time being in office who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said Seal was duly and properly affixed and that the same is the lawful Seal of the Assembly.

Mode of
execution of
documents

5. (a) The Assembly shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Assembly and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General;
- (b) all documents to be served on the Assembly may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.
