## Act No. 30 of 1973

[L.S.]

An Act to provide for the Incorporation of the South Trinidad Darts Association.

[Assented to 30th August, 1973]

Whereas there has been established in the Island of Trini-Preamble dad and Tobago a body known as the South Trinidad Darts League since 1965 which is desirous of operating under the name of the South Trinidad Darts Association.

And whereas it is expedient that the said South Trinidad Darts Association should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment

No. 30.

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the South Trinidad Darts Association (Incorporation) Act, 1973.

Incorporation

- 2. The organisation known as the South Trinidad Darts Association (hereinafter called "the Association") shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may sue and be sued in all courts of Justice in the Territory by that name, and shall have and use a common seal with power from time to time to change such seal.
- 3. The provisions of the Interpretation Act, shall as far as possible apply in the construction of this Act and of every section thereof. And, without prejudice to the generality of what is herebefore enacted in this section of this Act, but subject, nevertheless, to the express provisions of this Act and to the constitution of the Association and to any rules, regulations and bye-laws made and resolutions passed thereunder, it is more particularly hereby provided that nothing in this Act shall in any way derogate from the said Interpretation Act.

Objects and Functions

- 4. (1) The objects and functions of the South Trinidad Darts Association are:—
  - (a) To seek to promote and encourage the growth of Darts in the Territory.
  - (b) To seek to promote competitions and championships.
  - (c) To offer guidance and advice to any affiliated organisation existing or formed in the Territory.
- (2) The Association may make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and the discharge of its duties.

Powers of the Corporation

- 5. The corporate body hereby created shall have power:
  - (a) To acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;

- (c) Subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it shall have acquired title thereto, to sell, demise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by it.
- **6.** All documents requiring the seal of the said corporate Mode of execubody shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence documents of its President and Secretary for the time being in office who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the corporation.
- 7. The said corporate body shall at all times have a fixed Service of address for service of documents on the corporation documents on and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the corporation may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.
- **8.** Nothing in this Act shall affect the rights of Her saving of Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors or of any bodies politic Crown and or corporate or of any persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
