**Act No. 23 of 1984**

AN ACT for the incorporation of the Barrackpore  
Children's Lunch Association.

*[Assented to 21st September, 1984]*

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and <sup>Preamble</sup> Tobago an association known as the Barrackpore Children's Lunch Association:

<b>Enactment</b>	<b>BE IT ENACTED</b> by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—
<b>Short title</b>	<b>1.</b> This Act may be cited as the Barrackpore Children's Lunch Association (Incorporation) Act, 1984.
<b>Incorporation</b>	<b>2.</b> The Barrackpore Children's Lunch Association (hereinafter referred to as "the Association") is hereby created a body corporate.
<b>Aims and objects</b>	<b>3.</b> The aims and objects of the Association are— <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) to encourage improved facilities for the provision of nutritional services in schools in Trinidad and Tobago;</li><li>(b) to provide free meals for needy schoolchildren of the nation;</li><li>(c) to promote programmes for securing and providing medical services for the schoolchildren of the nation;</li><li>(d) to assist in supplying needy children with educational aids, books and other school requirements;</li><li>(e) to contribute to the improvement of the physical and mental well-being of schoolchildren;</li><li>(f) to establish facilities such as day nurseries, nursery schools and meal centres for schoolchildren;</li><li>(g) to work in association with any other community service organization for the attainment of the aims and objects of the Association.</li></ul>
<b>Powers of the Association</b>	<b>4.</b> For the furtherance of the objects of the Association, specified in section 3, the Association shall have power— <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or otherwise any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;</li></ul>

- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it acquired title thereto, to sell, demise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may, for the time being, be vested in it;
- (d) to sell, improve, manage, develop, lease, mortgage, dispose of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property of the Association;
- (e) to borrow any moneys required for the purpose of the Association upon such terms and upon such securities as may be determined;
- (f) to obtain, collect, request and receive money and funds by way of contributions, donations, subscriptions, legacies, grants and any other lawful method and accept and receive gifts of any description;
- (g) to do all such things as are incidental, or conducive to the furtherance and attainment of the above objects.

5. Any real or personal property of whatever nature now vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Association is hereby transferred to and vested in the Association.

Vesting of property

6. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by an Executive Committee whose election powers and procedures shall be as prescribed in the constitution and rules of the Association.

Committee to manage affairs

7. All documents requiring the Seal of the Association shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Association.

Mode of execution of documents

Service of  
documents

8. (1) The Association shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Association and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Association may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the Association.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Association liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

Power to  
make  
rules

9. The Association may make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and the discharge of its functions and may vary or revoke such rules.

Saving of  
state or  
other rights

10. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
