# Act No. 9 of 1984

[L.S.]

An Act to provide for the preservation of superannuation benefits to public officers in respect of their federal service as if that service were service under the Government of Trinidad and Tobago.

## [Assented to 11th April, 1984]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as Enactment follows—

1. This Act may be cited as the Federal Officers (Pre-short title servation of Superannuation Benefits) Act, 1984.

Interpretation

60

- 2. In this Act "public service in the Federation" means—
  - (a) public service of the former Federation of the West Indies; or
  - (b) service with the Interim Commissioner for the West Indies.

Preservation of superannuation and other benefits

- 3. (1) Where a person has had pensionable public service in the Federation and subsequently transferred to pensionable public service with the Government of Trinidad and Tobago, there are preserved to that person benefits accruing from his public service in the Federation whether or not the public service of that person with the Government of Trinidad and Tobago ended in pensionable circumstances.
- (2) Where a person referred to in subsection (1) leaves the service of the Government of Trinidad and Tobago—
  - (a) in non-pensionable circumstances, his pension benefits accruing from his public service in the Federation are payable to him on his attaining the age of sixty years:
  - (b) in pensionable circumstances, his public service in the Federation shall, for the purposes of calculating his pension benefits, be treated as if it were public service with the Government of Trinidad and Tobago.

(3) Where the Interim Commissioner for the West

Indies on behalf of persons referred to in subsection (1), paid to the Trinidad and Tobago Government transfer values as shown in the Schedule in respect of entitlements of such persons under the Federal Widows' and Orphans' Pension Scheme, the transfer values will be treated as if they were single contributions to the Trinidad and Tobago Widows' and Orphans' Pension Scheme established under the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Act on the dates of

such transfers, to purchase paid-up pensions in order to provide appropriate benefits for widows and orphans of
