AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Trinidad East
Lions Club, of St George, Trinidad, West Indies, and
for matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 12th August, 1982]

WHEREAS since 1967 there has been established in ^{Preamble} St. George East, Trinidad, West Indies, a community
service organisation known as the Trinidad East Lions
Club:

And whereas it is expedient that the said organisation should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Trinidad East Lions Club of St. George, Trinidad, West Indies (Incorporation) Act, 1982.

Incorporation

2. The Trinidad East Lion's Club of St. George (hereinafter referred to as "the Club") is created a body corporate.

Aims and objects

3. The aims and objects of the Club are:—

- (a) to create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world;
- (b) to promote the principle of good government and good citizenship;
- (c) to take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social, and moral welfare of the community;
- (d) to unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding;
- (e) to provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided however that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members;
- (f) to encourage service-minded men to serve their community without personal financial regard and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavours;
- (g) to take over the members, assets, rights and franchises of the unincorporated club known as the Trinidad East Lions Club of St. George, Trinidad, West Indies and its members; and

(h) to do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objectives.

4. All real or personal property of whatever nature now held or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Club, is hereby transferred to and vested in the Club. Vesting of property

5. (1) A document requiring the seal of the Club is not lawfully sealed unless it is, Mode of Execution of Documents

- (a) sealed with the common seal of the Club,
- (b) sealed in the presence of the President and Secretary, and
- (c) signed by the President and Secretary

(2) the signing of a document in accordance with subsection (1) is *prima facie* evidence that the seal.

- (a) is the lawful seal of the club, and
- (b) has been duly affixed.

6. (1) The Club shall have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation of the change of address. Service of Documents

(2) Every document to be served on the Club may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the Club.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Club liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

7. The club may make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and the discharge of its functions. Corporate body may make rules

8. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them. Saving of State or other right
