Act No. 7 of 1981

AN ACT to re-enact the Rent Restriction Ordinance,
Ch. 27. No. 18 and to validate things done
thereunder.

[Assented to 15th May, 1981]

WHEREAS it is enacted *inter alia* by subsection (1) of ^{Preamble} section 13 of the Constitution that an Act of Parliament to which that section applies may expressly declare

that it shall have effect even though inconsistent with sections 4 and 5 of the Constitution and, if any such Act does so declare, it shall have effect accordingly:

And whereas it is provided by subsection (2) of the said section 13 of the Constitution that an Act of Parliament to which that section applies is one the Bill for which has been passed by both Houses of Parliament and at the final vote thereon in each House has been supported by the votes of not less than three-fifths of all the members of that House:

And whereas it is necessary and expedient that the provisions of this Act shall have effect even though inconsistent with sections 4 and 5 of the Constitution:

Enactment

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—

Short title

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Rent Restriction (Re-enactment and Validation) Act, 1981.

Act at variance with Ch. 1 of the Constitution

(2) This Act shall have effect even though inconsistent with sections 4 and 5 of the Constitution.

Ch. 27. No. 18 re-enacted

2. The Rent Restriction Ordinance hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance" is re-enacted with effect from 24th February, 1981.

Validation of acts and things

3. All acts and things done or purported to be done in exercise of powers conferred under the Ordinance are deemed to have been lawfully and validly done, notwithstanding that the Ordinance ceased to have effect on the 23rd February, 1981.
