Act No. 2 of 1978

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Lions Club of
St. Patrick East, Trinidad, West Indies of Trinidad
and Tobago and for matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 23rd February, 1978]

WHEREAS for many years there has been established in ^{Preamble}
St. Patrick East in Trinidad and Tobago a leadership
service organisation known as the Lions Club of
St. Patrick East, Trinidad, West Indies.

And whereas it is expedient that the said organisation should be incorporated under the name of the Lions Club of St. Patrick East, Trinidad, West Indies.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Lions Club of St. Patrick East of Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1977.

Incorporation

2. The organisation known as the Lions Club of St. Patrick East, Trinidad, West Indies of Trinidad and Tobago shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession and may sue, and be sued in all courts of Justice in Trinidad and Tobago and shall have and use a common seal with power from time to time to change such seal.

**Power of
corporate
body**

3. The corporate body hereby created shall have power

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, demise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it shall have acquired title thereto, to sell, exchange, demise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in by it.

**Vesting of
property**

4. All property now held by or vested in the organisation or in any person for the use and benefit of the Club is hereby vested in the Lions Club of St. Patrick East, Trinidad, West Indies.

5. All documents requiring the seal of the said corporate body shall be sealed with its common seal in the presence of at least two officers of the Association who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the corporate body.

Mode of
execution of
documents

6. (1) The said corporate body shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the corporate body and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the corporate body may be served by leaving same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the address so registered.

Service of
documents

(2) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is an offence and renders the corporate body liable on summary conviction to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction thereof.

7. The said corporate body may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, power and functions, with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations.
