**AN ACT for the incorporation of the Glory Church
and for matters incidental thereto**

[Assented to 4th October, 1995]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Preamble
Tobago an Organization known as the Glory Church:

And whereas it is expedient that the Glory Church
should be incorporated for the purposes hereinafter set
forth:

Enactment	ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—
Short title	1. This Act may be cited as the Glory Church (Incorporation) Act, 1995.
Incorporation	2. The Glory Church (hereinafter called “the Organization”) is hereby created a body corporate.
Aims and objects	3. The aims and objects of the Organization are— <ol style="list-style-type: none">(a) to promote and disseminate the gospel of Jesus Christ through preaching, teaching and counselling;(b) to support other organizations with similar aims and objects;(c) to organize local and foreign congregations;(d) to assemble together in worship for mutual edification and Christian fellowship in Jesus Christ and to organize and conduct meetings in the open air or in any other place that the organization may lawfully do so;(e) to build, organize and operate schools and other institutions of learning and research in fields related to Education and Christianity;(f) to assist in the provision of libraries, reading rooms, book shops, publishing houses, scholarship funds and lectures for the advancement of education;(g) to publish Christian literature and other media material which may be considered necessary to further the aims and objects of the Organization;(h) to support underprivileged students, scholars or other persons whose services may be considered conducive to the

attainment of the objects of the Organization in the form of grants, loans, salaries and scholarships;

- (i) to assist, care and provide for underprivileged persons;
- (j) to build, organize and operate facilities for housing and caring of poor, underprivileged persons;
- (k) to receive, request and collect monies, subscriptions, or donations by way of gift or otherwise for achieving the aims and objects of the Organization;
- (l) to do all such things as are necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above aims and objects.

4. The Organization shall have power—

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, demise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance, lease or howsoever otherwise any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) to sell, exchange, devise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in it, subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title.

5. All real and personal property now held by and vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Organization is hereby transferred to and vested in the Organization.

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Organization shall be sealed with the common seal of the Organization in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office or in the event of incapacity in the presence of some other person or persons authorised for that purpose by the Organization who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Organization.

Service of
documents

7. (1) The Organization shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Organization and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation of the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Organization may be served by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the Organization.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Organization liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

Power to make
rules

8. The Organization may from time to time make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions and may amend such rules.

Saving of State
and other rights

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
