**AN ACT for the incorporation of the Calvary Revival
Centre and matters incidental thereto**

[Assented to 13th July, 1995]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Preamble
Tobago an organization known as the Calvary Revival
Centre:

And whereas it is expedient that the Calvary Revival Centre be incorporated for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

| Enactment | ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:— |
| Short title | 1. This Act may be cited as the Calvary Revival Centre (Incorporation) Act, 1995. |
| Incorporation | 2. The Calvary Revival Centre hereinafter called “The Organisation” is hereby created a body corporate. |
| Aims and objects | 3. The aims and objects of the organisation are: <ul style="list-style-type: none">(a) to establish and maintain a place for the worship of Almighty God Our Heavenly Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ, his only begotten son, through the holy spirit, and for the promotion of christian fellowship, baptism, the Lord’s supper, praise, testimony and the Ministry of the Word, discipline and the furtherance of the Gospel;(b) to establish and maintain such departments, ministries and institutions as may be deemed necessary for the propagation of the Gospel;(c) to set up a high moral standard and code of conduct, for the encouragement of the spiritual development of its members and adherents of the Organisation;(d) to confer and co-operate with other religious communities, as may be required;(e) to cultivate among its members love and respect for all mankind, and for God the Father and his Son, the Lord Jesus Christ; |

- (f) to publish christian literature in order to further the aims and objects of the Organisation;
- (g) to provide assistance to the underprivileged through humanitarian services and charitable ventures;
- (h) to build, organize and operate facilities to house underprivileged persons;
- (i) to request, receive and collect funds, subscriptions and donations for achieving the aims and objects of the Organisation;
- (j) to do all such other things as are necessary or conducive to the attainment of the above-mentioned objects.

4. The Organisation shall have power—

Powers of the
Organisation

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) to sell, exchange, demise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in it subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title;
- (d) to borrow or raise money in such manner as the Organisation deems fit, and to secure the repayment thereof by way of mortgage, charge or lien upon the whole or any part of the Organisation's property or assets.

Transfer and vesting
of property

5. All real or personal property of whatever nature now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Organisation, is hereby transferred to and vested in the Organisation.

Mode of execution of
documents

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Organisation shall be sealed with the common seal of the Organisation in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office or in the event of incapacity, in the presence of some other person or persons authorised for that purpose by the Organisation, who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed, and that the same is the lawful seal of the Organisation.

Service of documents

7. (1) The Organisation shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on it, and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of the incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Organisation may be served by leaving same at, or by sending the same by registered post, to the registered address of the Organisation.

(3) Failure to register the address or any change thereof is a summary offence, and renders the Organisation liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars, and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

Power to make rules

8. The Organisation may from time to time make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings, and discharge of its duties, powers and functions, and such rules may be amended from time to time.

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in the Act, and those claiming by, through, from or under them. Saving of State and other rights
