1. This Act may be cited as the Finance (Supplemen- Short title
tation and Variation of Appropriation) (1992) Act, 1993.

2. In this Act and in any other written law, a reference to the Appropriation Act, 1992, shall be construed as a reference to that Act as for the time being varied or otherwise amended by any Finance (Variation of Appropriation) Act, passed before this or that other written law.

3. A further issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sum of seventy-seven million, nine hundred and sixty-seven thousand, four hundred and sixty-six dollars is hereby authorized for meeting expenditure for the service of the year ending 31st December, 1992.

4. The sums appropriated to the several Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part I of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 1992, are hereby increased by the amounts specified in the Second Column of that Part.

5. The sums appropriated to the several Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part II of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 1992, are hereby reduced by the amounts specified in the Second Column of that Part.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Exchequer and Audit Act, the sums appropriated in respect of the Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part II of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 1992, and unissued at the commencement of this Act, may be utilized for the discharge of any liability incurred by reason of the increase in the expenditure in respect of the Heads of Expenditure set out in Part I of the Schedule.
