REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO Act No. 19 of 1986

[L.S.]

AN ACT for the incorporation of the Kiwanis Club of Chaguanas, Trinidad, and for matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 19th August, 1986]

WHEREAS since 1978 there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago a community service organization known as the Kiwanis Club of Chaguanas:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Kiwanis Club of Chaguanas should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment	ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—
Short title	1. This Act may be cited as the Kiwanis Club of Chaguanas (Incorporation) Act, 1986.
Incorporation	2. The Kiwanis Club of Chaguanas (hereinafter called "the Club") is hereby created a body corporate.
Aims and objects	 3. The aims and objects of the Club are— (a) to give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life; (b) to encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships; (c) to promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business and professional standards; (d) to develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship; (e) to provide through the Club, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build a better community; (f) to co-operate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and goodwill; (g) to take over the assets, rights and franchises of the community service organization, known as the Kiwanis Club of Chaguanas and its members;
	conducive to the attainment of the above objects.
Powers of the Club	 4. The Club shall have power— (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;

- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title, to sell, exchange, devise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in it.

5. All real or personal property of whatever nature ^{Vesting of} now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Club, is hereby transferred to and vested in the Club.

6. (1) All documents requiring the seal of the Club $\frac{Mode of}{execution of}$ shall be sealed with the common seal of the Club in the documents presence of the President and Secretary both of whom shall sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and is the lawful seal of the Club.

(2) Where the President or the Secretary is incapacitated, a person duly authorised by the Club shall perform the functions of the incapacitated person in the manner outlined in subsection (1).

7. (1) The Club shall at all times have a fixed address ^{Service of} documents in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Club and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Club may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the registered address of the Club.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Club liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

Power to make rules

Saving of State and other rights 8. The Club may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations.

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
