REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 4 of 2003

[L.S.]

AN ACT to vary the appropriation of the sum the issue of
which was authorized by the Appropriation Act, 2002

[Assented to 30th January, 2003]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as Enactment
follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Finance (Variation of Short title
Appropriation) (2002) Act, 2003.

- Construction of Act No. 12 of 2001
- 2.** In this Act and in any other written law, a reference to the Appropriation Act, 2002 shall be construed as a reference to that Act as for the time being varied or otherwise amended by any Finance (Variation of Appropriation) Act, passed before this or that other written law.
- Increase in Heads of Expenditure—Schedule
- 3.** The sums appropriated to the Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part I of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 2002 are increased by the amounts specified in the Second Column of that Part.
- Reduction in Heads of Expenditure
- 4.** The sums appropriated to the Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part II of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 2002 are reduced by the amounts specified in the Second Column of that Part.
- Sums appropriated to Heads specified in Part II may be utilized
- 5.** The sums appropriated to the Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part II of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 2002 and not utilized at the commencement of this Act and not exceeding the amounts specified as reduced in the Second Column of Part II of the Schedule may be utilized, notwithstanding anything contained in the Exchequer and Audit Act, for the discharge of any liability incurred by reason of the increase in the expenditure in respect of the Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part I of the Schedule.
