AN ORDINANCE to make special provision for the grant of an injury allowance to PHILIP IGNATIUS BLANC, retired Deputy Comptroller of Customs and Excise.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the Enactment advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Blanc (Injury Short title. Allowance) Ordinance, 1952.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any law relating to the grant of pensions, there may be paid from general revenue by monthly instalments to PHILIP IGNATIUS BLANC, retired Deputy Comptroller of Customs and Excise, an injury allowance at the rate of four hundred and eighty dollars per annum as from the 21st January, 1952 in addition to the pension payable to the said PHILIP IGNATIUS BLANC under the Pensions Ordinance.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Income Tax Ordinance, the injury allowance provided for by section 2 of this Ordinance shall be exempt from income tax.

Passed in Council this twenty-third day of May in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two.
