AN ORDINANCE to effect the repeal of certain provisions
of the Cocoa Subsidy (Special Taxation) Ordinance,

Commencement

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cocoa Subsidy
(Special Taxation) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1954, and shall
be read as one with the Cocoa Subsidy (Special Taxation)
Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. The provisions of section 2 and of paragraph (a) of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance (which relate to the levy and collection of additional taxation on incomes, and to the application thereof towards a subsidy fund for the relief of the cocoa industry of the Colony) shall be deemed to have been in abeyance and of no effect in respect of any and every year of assessment in which such levy has hitherto not been collected and applied; and the said provisions are hereby repealed and declared for all future purposes to be of no further force or effect whatsoever.
