AN ORDINANCE to amend the Police Ordinance,
Ch. 11. No. 1.

[31st December, 1954.]

Commencement

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with ^{Enactment}
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Police (Amendment) ^{Short title}
(No. 2) Ordinance, 1954, and shall be read as one with the
Police Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal ^{Ch. 11. No. 1}
Ordinance.

New sections
51A and 51B
to be added
after section 51
of Principal
Ordinance

2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition, immediately after section 51 thereof, of the following new sections to be numbered respectively 51A and 51B :—

“Power of
Governor to
suspend
pension in
case of
subsequent
enlistment

51A. If any Inspector, subordinate officer or constable to whom a pension has been granted under this Ordinance is subsequently enlisted in the Force, the payment of his pension may, if the Governor so directs, be suspended during the period of his subsequent enlistment.

Computation of
pension where
break in
service occurs

51B. (1) The period of service in respect of which pension or gratuity may be granted under this Ordinance must be unbroken: Provided that, subject to the conditions contained in subsection (2) hereof, the period of service prior to a break of service may be counted together with service subsequent to such break in cases where the service was interrupted by reason of ill-health or other cause not arising from misconduct or voluntary withdrawal from the Force.

(2) The conditions referred to in the preceding subsection are :—

- (a) any pension which at the time of the subsequent enlistment is being paid shall cease to be paid ; and
- (b) if the Governor so requires, any gratuity paid in respect of the earlier period of service, or such part thereof as the Governor may determine, shall be refunded.”
