AN ORDINANCE to amend the Interpretation Ordinance,  
Ch. 1. No. 2.

[10th June, 1954]

Commencement

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the Enactment  
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Interpretation Short title  
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1954, and shall be read as one with Ch. 1. No. 2  
the Interpretation Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the  
Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by substituting for the definition of "Crown Agents" therein the following definition:—

'"Crown Agents" means the persons, or any of the persons, who, prior to the first day of April, 1954, were designated Crown Agents for the Colonies, in England, and from and after that date are designated Crown Agents for Oversea Governments and Administrations, in England;'

(b) by inserting immediately after the word "Government" appearing in the definition of "Governor" the words "and, to the extent to which a Deputy for the Governor is authorised to act, that Deputy";

(c) by substituting for the definition of "Governor in Council" or "Governor in Executive Council" therein the following definition:

'"Governor in Council" or "Governor in Executive Council" means the Governor acting in consultation with, and save as otherwise provided by any Instructions under Her Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet in accordance with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony.'

Passed in Council this twenty-first day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-four.
