AN ORDINANCE to amend the Governor's Emoluments Ordinance, Ch. 9. No. 1

[30th December, 1954.]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with Enactment the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Governor's Short title and commencement Emoluments (Amendment) Ordinance, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Governor's Emoluments Ordinance, hereinafter Ch. 9. No. 1 referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(2) This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1954.

**2.** Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following section :—

"Emoluments  
of Governor

2. The emoluments attached to the office of Governor of the Colony shall consist of—

- (a) salary at the rate of twenty-four thousand dollars per annum; and
- (b) duty allowance at the rate of nine thousand six hundred dollars per annum."

Section 6 of

**3.** Section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following section :—

"Remuneration  
of officer  
administering  
the Government,

6. In the absence of the Governor from the Colony in the circumstances provided by sections 3 to 5 inclusive of this Ordinance, the officer administering the Government shall receive—

- (i) an amount equal to ninety-five per cent. of the salary attached to the office of Governor; and
- (ii) the full amount of the duty allowance attached to the office of Governor."

Adjustment

**4.** For the purposes of computing any salary or duty allowance payable in pursuance of this Ordinance to the Governor or to the officer administering the Government in respect of the year 1954 or any part thereof, there shall be taken into account any salary or duty allowance, as the case may be, already paid to him in respect of the said year or part thereof.
