**E**NACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the  
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Police (Amendment)  
Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read as one with the Police Ordinance,  
1950, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title

Validation of  
certain original  
enlistments in  
the Force

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 28 of the Principal Ordinance which relate to the maximum age for original enlistment in the Force, or of any previous law relating to the said maximum age which have been replaced by the said provisions, the original enlistment in the Force of every person serving in the Force at the date of the commencement of this Ordinance as an Inspector, subordinate police officer, or constable, who at the date of his original enlistment in the Force had already attained the age of thirty-five years, shall be and be deemed always to have been valid in law.

3. Where any such person retires from the Force after having served therein for not less than fifteen years and is ineligible for pension under the provisions of subsection (3) of section 49 of the Principal Ordinance by reason only of not having served in the Force for not less than twenty years as required by the said subsection, there may be granted to such person a monthly pension not exceeding one four hundred and eightieth of a month's pay for each completed month of service in the Force.
